## **Report of the Annual Meeting, Saturday, March 13, 2013.**

This year's membership attendance at the annual meeting held at Toos and Frank Judge's home, was greater than we have had in recent years. The meeting was called to order shortly after 5 PM by Ton Broos. Ton announced that long time member Hendrika Nol-Heynes of Bloomfield Township passed away in December. We extend our sympathy to her husband Edward Nol who has graciously continued membership in the NAUL. After the minutes of the 2012 meeting were read and approved, Karla Vandersypen presented the secretary's report, highlighting activities and programs held in the year since the last meeting. Lineke Zuiderweg presented the Treasurer's report. It was reviewed and approved. The NAUL is still solvent with assets totaling \$8,469.06 as of December 31, 2012. Expenditures for 2012 totaled \$2,392.57. Income from membership was \$1,679.03 leaving a deficit for 2012 of \$713.54. Membership is relatively stable. We currently have about 90 members. This does not include the children of those family members. Board members Irene Butter, Nanna Fecteau, Toos Judge, Els Nieuwenhuijsen and Lineke Zuiderweg whose current terms were expiring were approved for continuation on the board. There were no additional nominations from the floor. Hospitality chairperson Els Nieuwenhuijsen could not attend the meeting but her report was read by President Ton Broos. Janet Broos continues as Newsletter editor and asked for input from the members and or suggestions for topics they wish to see in the newsletter.

Some future programs were finalized, namely:

The new home of the Film Institute in Amsterdam is the *EYE*. It is situated on the north bank of the IJ waterway. You can see a movie or have a coffee or snack on a terrace as you watch the boats move along the IJ. To get there, board the commuter ferry behind the Central Station.

## FINALLY

The Rijksmuseum will reopen after 10 Years. What took so long? Five years late and tens of millions of Euros over budget. But we hear it is worth the wait. The “new” look was designed by Spanish architects Cruz y Ortiz. They have restored the original layout and ornamental details that had been obliterated over the years by bad “renovations”. Two of the old inner courtyards have been made into a single atrium by sinking them below ground level. It is the public face of the museum, a soaring 24,000 square foot glass roofed space with Polish stone floors. This space can be visited without an entrance ticket (museum tickets cost \$19). Museum officials believe that it will become an urban hangout, similar to London's Turbine Hall at the Tate. Eventually there will be performances and art installations. It is expected that the renovated museum will attract as many as 2 million visitors annually. For the first time, the museum's historical library will be open to the public. It is said to be a lofty three-story cast-iron space where visitors will be given I-pads as museum officials felt that putting computers in the room would “contaminate it visually”

The “Night Watch” will hang in its time honored space, at the end of the Gallery of Honor. This is not to be missed.

The King and the party move to the New Church.

**2:00 – 3:30 PM**

Installation of the King and oath taking by all Members of Parliament during the meeting of the States-General in the New Church. Various speeches by members.

**4:30 – 5:30 PM**

Reception for visiting dignitaries and members of States-General in the Royal Palace.
